Upon completion of training, fellows will be well positioned to be active participants in crucial policy debates about the future development and implementation of tobacco control interventions. The program offers supervised research experience in tobacco control with the Center faculty.</p>

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November and May	Clinical and Translational Science Institute	<a href="#">Resident Clinical and Translational Research Grant</a>	Up to \$4K / academic year  Application cycle – twice a year.  <b>Funds:</b> Tuition, design & biostats consultation, analytic support, and study-related travel	The Resident Clinical and Translational Research Funding (RRF) program will provide up to \$4,000 per academic year to UCSF residents for qualified clinical and translational research expenses not covered by their mentor or other sources. Applications require the description of the proposed project for which the funds will be used, to be conducted under the guidance of a research mentor. Applications will be accepted twice a year and the most meritorious projects will be funded.

LOI: August  New applications / resubmissions: November	Tobacco-Related Disease Research Program of California	<a href="#">Post-Doctoral Fellowship Award</a>	Up to \$60K; 1-3 yrs  Allowable direct costs include: Stipend, tuition & fees, institution allowance and travel to TRDRP conference	The Tobacco-Related Disease Research Program of California (TRDRP) administers the portion of state retail taxes on tobacco products that are designated for research within California. This unique source of funding supports investigators at eligible California institutions whose research contributes directly to the elimination of smoking and tobacco use and mitigates its human and economic costs in California.

Salary support; 2yrs	<p>The purpose of the CIF is to create health informatics leaders and includes the experience and training necessary to become a productive academic contributor, a healthcare enterprise Chief Health or Medical Information Officer (CHIO/CMIO), or a successful informatician in the world of industry.</p> <p>Upon completion of the CIF, graduates will take the Clinical Informatics exam administered by the American Board of Preventive Medicine and become board certified in Clinical Informatics.</p>
March	UCSF	<a href="#">Clinical Research Informatics Postdoctoral Fellowship (CRISP)</a>	Annual stipend based off NIH scale in addition to housing allowance and tuition assistance for didactic training; 1-2 yrs	<p>The CRISP Fellowship provides tailored training for clinician investigators who seek to improve healthcare through the science of clinical research informatics.</p> <p>CRISP fellows will receive in-depth training in clinical research informatics and data science through coursework in the Training in Clinical Research (TICR) program in the Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics, conduct a mentored research</p>

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				project, and participate in regular work-in-progress sessions. No prior experience in Clinical Research Informatics is required; however, this program will be most effective for those who have identified a potential project associated with an area of healthcare needing improvement.
November	UCSF Stimulating Access to Research in Residency Program	<a href="#">StARR Fellowship</a> (separate NHLBI-funded and NIA-funded tracks)	StARR Program covers 80% of residents' salaries during their StARR year and provides funds to support didactic training in research. All else is covered by their residency programs or departments; 1yr	This program seeks to recruit, support and train outstanding clinical residents with the potential to become successful clinical and translational researchers.  With funding from two NIH institutes, the National Heart Lung and Blood Institute (NHLBI) and the National Institute on Aging (NIA), StARR supports UCSF residents for a contiguous year (July to June), in which residents devote a minimum of 80% time to research and research-related training, while the remaining 20% of their time can be spent on patient care.
